Speaker of the Month—Val Honeywood



At our April meeting we were blessed to have Val bring along some of her beautiful 'Billys' and share with us her insights into her collection and what is in volved with looking after them.

The first tip Val shared was that she never transports her plants in the boot of the car, always in the car, this way the plants don't overheat and burn.

Val then showed us the range of variegation and striation with some of her examples. While doing this Val talked about the trial and error of finding the right mix for the plants and what she has found to be best is a 50/50 mix of coarse bark that has been put through the mulcher and cymbidium orchid mix.

Val was asked about feeding of the billbergias and told us that she has found billys tend to do better when 'starved' for food. There is only one fertilizer that she uses, Organic Extra—with a mother plant the dose is a good handful, less for a young pup. When it comes to getting them to flower, you need to find their 'happy spot' in the garden. Unfortunately billbergia flowers do not tend to last long.
