Hello All

Well no doubt by now you're all suffering from cabin fever like me, and it doesn't look like ending any time soon. The latest scientific and medical advice is that until they come up with an effective vaccine, ending the lockdown could cause a worse outbreak than we now have, so I'm not holding my breath.

If there is a bright side to it all it's the fact that most of us have plenty of work to do in our gardens and lots of time to do it, and as the nurseries are classed as an essential service getting supplies isn't too much of a hassle.

Probably the best news we've had club wise since we last met is that our application for a grant from the Gambling Community Benefit Committee was approved, and we were given the full \$6,698.63 to buy all the equipment we'd asked for. After waiting nearly six months I was beginning to think we weren't successful, but sometimes it pays to have a bit more patience.

As you'll see from the Diary Dates April and May's meetings, as well as the May Monster Sale, have been cancelled, and at this stage June is looking doubtful as well, but you'll be kept informed as we go along, and the committee will be guided by what the experts tell us.

For those who go to the Queensland Garden Expo at Nambour in July, at this stage their website says it's still on, but is subject to the Covid-19 laws. As other shows later in the year have already been cancelled, including the Ekka, I would be very surprised if it goes ahead, which is unfortunate because it's an excellent chance to see what's new in the world of Bromeliads.

Over the last couple of years there have been many reclassifications of certain Bromeliads into different genus, and this has caused some (or a lot of) confusion. Here's an explanation that may explain how these changes come about.

LUMPERS VS. SPLITTERS (Or why are there all the name changes that we have seen lately?)

(From a dictionary) "Taxonomists are biologists who determine the scientific names of organisms and then group organisms into a hierarchy into an orderly system. In taxonomy, there are two tendencies about how to classify living things: By their differences or by their similarities.

A "Lumper' is a taxonomist who groups by similar traits, assuming that differences are not as important as similarities. They place organisms which share a few major characteristics in the same group. When two named species are discovered to be of the same species, the older species name is usually retained, and the newer species name dropped, a process called synonymization or convivially, as lumping.

A 'Splitter' is a taxonomist who takes precise definitions, and creates new categories to classify organism on the basis of the smallest known difference, so every small difference is considered sufficient to create a new separate group. Dividing a taxon into multiple, often new, taxa is called splitting. For example in the family Cactaceae 'lumpers' recognize 30-50 genera and about 1000 species, 'splitters' judge right to consider 200 genera and over 2000 species."

Charles Darwin is thought to have originated these terms in 1857.

The rush of new names we have seen lately (Cryptanthus was suddenly broken into 4 genera for example) means that splitters seem to currently be in charge of the Bromeliad world. Even a major tool for classifying plants, such as DNA, may not solve this basic classification tendency difference.

Library: All books and magazines borrowed are to be returned in good order to the following meeting. If they aren't on a wait list, they may be rebooked.












LATE NEWS

A true Aussie character who possessed a tremendous sense of humour and who loved telling a yarn or seven.


