A bit about our guest speaker Nev Ryan

Pam Butler, the BSQ Roving Reporter recently visited the garden of Neville Ryan.

Neville's backyard is Tillandsia heaven for the Tillandsia enthusiast. He lives on a 405 square metre block at Upper Mt.Gravatt. His entire backyard is used for growing plants (even the clothesline).

He grows mostly Tillandsia but has a small number of other Genera. Tillandsias are popular because most are epiphytes and grown on mounts. Some are potted but mostly the bigger T.fasciculata types and some of the bigger hybrids.

Neville waters his plants once a week in winter and up to 3 times a week in summer. He keeps his plants growing well by fertilising fortnightly in summer and every 3 weeks in winter.

Mealy bugs are treated with a systemic insecticide if they infect the plants. Rats can also cause devastating damage to his Tillandsias if they move in.

Potting mix is a mix of Orchid mix, coir peat and charcoal.

Neville first became interested in Bromeliads when he saw a blooming Bromelifolia at the EKKA nearly 50 years ago. His aunt grew some Billbergia and Nidularium and he saw an article in Your Garden magazine on Olwyn Ferris which piqued his interest further. Neville joined BSA in 1972. He was purchasing plants interstate from Olwyn Ferris, Peter Sang, Maurice Kellet and Ed Schaefer.

He also attended Bromeliad shows to buy plants only to see the members taking their purchases out to their cars while he waited outside in the entry queue. As a result of this he joined BSQ in1983.

Neville has served on the committee and as Show Convenor. He spent many years as the Supper Person and also judged our shows with Olive Trevor for a long time.

He encourages new members to help out at meetings and shows. This is the best way to meet other members and learn about the plants.

His other interests are orchids, foliage plants and Anthuriums.

He is also a member of the Gold Coast Bromeliad Society and the Cordyline Society.

Final advice: Enjoy your plants and grow more Tillandsias!!

Suggestions for members - enjoy your plants, volunteer to help at meetings and you will get a lot more from the meetings and make friends along the way.

If you are running short and need something it would be appreciated if you could ring Maxine on 41245128 to possibly make arrangements to pick them up from her home prior to the meeting.


Goff has potting mix for sale at \$8 for a 30 litre bag, and if you ring him on 0416783773 you can also possibly make arrangements to get some from him.


