# DID YOU KNOW ...



While we may complain about insects attacking our bromeliads here in Queensland, the genera in its natural habitat in South America has a bigger pest to contend with ... the Spectacled Bear also known as the Andean Bear.

They are found almost entirely in the Andes Mountains through Venezuela, Colombia, Ecuador, Peru, and Bolivia in a wide variety of habitats and altitudes including cloud forests, high-altitude grasslands, dry forests, and scrub deserts.

Spectacled bears are more herbivorous than most other bears and bromeliads can make up 50% of their diet which also includes palm nuts, bamboo hearts, orchid bulbs, and unopened palm leaves. They also eat cultivated plants, such as sugarcane, honey, and corn.

The spectacled bears are classified as Vulnerable on the Endangered Species List and their numbers are decreasing.

- **♦ Membership 2022** ... membership fees are due by the 31st December 2021 to ensure your FCBSI membership remains active for 2022.



This is the second volume in the series and summarises the 15 genera in the subfamily ... **Pitcairnioideae**. The two genera that occur in Ecuador are *Pitcairnia* and *Puyu*.

Each species is shown in detail with a description of the plant, collections studied, distribution, etymology, keys and detailed photographs.

It is a large hardback edition with 303 pages and many color illustrations.

What a great privilege for our Society.

To be an accredited BSI judge, certain minimum requirements must be met.

# These include:

- being a member of the BSI and an affilliate of the BSI
- growing at least 50 different bromeliads in at least 10 different genera,
- successfully complete 6 bromeliad schools over 3 years and passing the points scoring examination at the end of each school;
- passing a final exam on the required reading material;
- serve as a clerk or co-chair on one of eight committees;
- served as a judge at three BSI standard shows; and
- must have won five blue ribbons in BSI Standard or Judged shows.

# TILLANDSIA 'PINK PATCHES' (BCR 16970)

**Tillandsia 'Pink Patches'** is a Neville Ryan cultivar registered by Dale Dixon. It is a cultivar of Tillandsia recurvifolia var. subsecundifolia x Tillandsia sprengeliana. Neville, who is an annual visitor to the Society's meetings, made the cross in 2005. It was named after his sister's dog.

The Bromeliad Cultivar Register (BCR) description is:

Secund, scurfed dark green leaves, narrowly-triangular, each tapering to a point. Short, compact inflorescence to 13cm. long with rosy red floral bracts, sparsely covered with lepidote scales. Cerise pink/mauve flowers.

A nice little plant to look out for ... definitely on my wishlist.
