# JUNE MONTHLY MEETING REPORT

Just when you think we're over Covid disruption, it surfaces again ... this time with our host for the BBQ/ charity raffle meeting testing positive a couple of days before the event. Sue swung into action and did the ring around to find a new venue.

A big thank you to David and Lorraine Ward for opening their garden for us to enjoy and hold our monthly meeting.

The sausage sizzle went ahead with Sue and Tara Casey arming themselves with the tongs and preparing the sausages for our members to enjoy before we got down to business.

After, enjoying a sausage (or two), members took up the pencils and cast their votes for Plant of the Month.

Vice President Les opened the meeting, welcomed members and guests and updated members on Management Committees activities.

Unfortunately our 'Show, Tell and Ask' segment this month was a non event with no members bringing anything. Come on ... out into the garden and find a plant to bring along to show or ask about.

Our guest speaker, Neville Ryan showed us some of his plants and shared his experiences in growing Tillandsias. Some of the many he showed our members were:

T. peiranoi ... a very small species like a tiny edithae in shape but paleacea in bloom.

**7. 'Tammy'** ... this is one of Neville's hybrids - *T. streptophilla x pruinosa*. A bulbous -based rosette to 30cm diam. x 25cm high with grey green channelled leaves, a pink bract with tubular mauve flowers.

**7.** 'Uluru' ... another of Neville's hybrids. One parent is reportedly *T*. 'Domingensis' - a cultivar of *T*. *capitata*. There are suspicions the other is T. ionantha. Uluru was an apt name because the plant is red and it just sits there for years doing nothing – just like the rock!

**T. mauryana** ... plant grows in groups or clumps, flowering it grows 5 to 15cm tall with many silver grey bent back leaves, reddish pink floral bracts with pale green/dark green tubular flowers. 'A small, green flowering Tillandsia from Mexico.

The Q&A session was very interactive, Thanks to Neville for his informative and entertaining talk.

During the refreshment break, members converged on the table of tillandsia's Neville had for sale.

After a break, Plant of the Month winners were announced with each of the category winners providing a short resume on their winning plant to give members a bit of background.

Closing the meeting with the monthly raffle. This month saw a great selection of prizes and many members heading home with a variety of plants.


Please note the following changes to the Society's calendar:

### BOOKS IN OUR LIBRARY ...

### New Tillandsia Handbook

by Hideo Shmizu & Hiroyuli Takizawa (1998)



This book is essentially a photo album. In the words of the authors...this book is not to educate, but to try to capture and convey the extraordinary beauty of the Tillandsia species. Each plant is shown in bloom and in some cases includes close-ups of the flower and inflorescence.

This book is not a scientific publication, but a concise collection of photos, with many unusual Tillandsia's included and only a very brief description of each plant.

The book is divided into 4 sections:

- 1. Photos of species in their natural habitat,
- 2. Tillandsia A Z with species in bloom, including some close-ups of the flower and inflorescence,
- 3. Tillandsia hybrids, and
- 4. Cultivation...unfortunately this section has very little translation.

Despite the short descriptions in English, the book can be very useful in identifying plants.

# PLANT OF THE MONTH CATEGORY UPDATE ...

There has been some confusion around the Plant of the Month categories over the past few months. The following is the current definition behind each category:

### **NEOREGELIA** ...

The Neoregelia category is broken into three sections rotating through a three monthly meeting cycle.

Each section is:

MINI - small sized Neos up to 250mm.

MIDI - medium sized Neos between 250mm and 450mm.

MAXI - large sized Neos over 450mm.

(All measurements refer to mature diameter as per the Encyclopaedia of Bromeliads and the Bromeliad Cultivar Register)

### PATTERN LEAFED VRIESEAS ...

Open to any pattern leafed Vriesea.

(Refer to categories - Flowering Bromeliad and Other Genera for other Vriesea species and cultivars.)

### TILLANDSIAS ...

The Tillandsia category is divided into two sections rotating through a two monthly meeting cycle.

Each section is :

**POTTED** - plants that are placed in a potting mix in a pot or other container.

**MOUNTED** - any plant that is mounted on a board, wire, terracotta pot, cork, tree branch, etc. and has no potting mix.

### FLOWERING BROMELIADS ...

Any **FLOWERING** Bromeliad genera (including **non**-pattern leafed *Vrieseas*) that does not fall into the above categories, ie. no *Neoregelias*, pattern-leafed *Vrieseas* or *Tillandsias*.

### OTHER GENERA ...

Any **Non FLOWERING** Bromeliad genera (including **non**-pattern leafed *Vrieseas*) that does not fall into the first three categories, i.e. no *Neoregelias*, pattern-leafed *Vrieseas* or *Tillandsias*.
