JANUARY MONTHLY MEETING REPORT ...

Our first meeting of the year was held in oppressive heat at the Dundowran Hall and a few New Year teething problems, ie. lack of Raffle tickets and sound system issues.

Vice President Les H. got proceedings underway, welcoming new and old members. This was followed by the birthday draw and Lucky Door number tickets being hand made as we had run out of raffle tickets, Stan then came to the rescue as he found a spare book of tickets in his car.

Next time we run out of tickets, I a vision of a few member may produce spare books from bags, boxes or their cars.



Les then updated members on key points from the Management Committee.

Next was our featured genus - Vriesea as part of the "Show, Tell and Ask" segment. Not many plants were shown but we'll work on that going forward in 2023.

Please note that this month's featured plant is **Billbergia**. Les is hoping that member's bring in at least one **Billbergia** each to show ... it may be one of your favourite plants, maybe it's not looking the best, or just an everyday plant. It could let members see a variety of **Bilbergia** specimens and where we get the same plant, show how different growing conditions impact the plant.

Our guest speaker was Cheryl Basic from Wildfire Gardens on the Sunshine Coast who spoke on Bromeliad species. An enlightening presentation from Cheryl that put our focus back on the species of bromeliads. As we have heard previously from George Stamatis, species are dying out in the wild, and we need to do all we can to preserve them.

After a cuppa and biscuit, the winners of the Plant of the Month Competition were announced with a good selection of plants entered. Don't worry winners (and members) ... our Winner's Mini presentation about the your winning plant will be back next month.

The afternoon closed with the raffle being drawn and many members going home with some new plants for their gardens /collections. Thanks to all members for your contribution of raffle prizes.









A Précis of Cheryl Basic's Presentation - Bromeliad Species ...

Cheryl started collecting *Catopsis* early in her career. In early collections, *Catopsis compacta* was always mounted probably because it was found as an epiphyte growing high in the treetops. Growers started potting them and they grew much bigger. She ordered a lot from Chris Larsen in Melbourne, both male and female, but they had no names, and although they have propagated successfully, they remain nameless.

Catopsis morreana was another favourite because of the attractive silvery coating of trichomes on its leaves. It is from Mexico



and has an attractive white silvery coating of trichomes. Another from Mexico is *Catopsis subulata* which was compared to a specimen one of our member's had brought in. It was interesting the discussion that ensued about the environmental differences between the two specimens.

Neoregelias has been a longtime favourite of Cheryl's. The species of **Neoregelia** have produced thousands of hybrids. Nowdays, species are getting rarer to find and being lost due to the popularity of the cultivars. Old growers might forget and new growers do not know the many beautiful species. **Neoregelia smithii** is one attractive species. Another is **Neoregelia pauciflora** especially popular as it can form into a spectacular clump.

One group of former *Neoregelias* that have retained her interest over many years, are the *Hylaeaicum* ... a genus published in 2021 and named after the ancient forest region known as Hylaea in the Amazon basin. It consists of 12 epiphytic species, has leaves with teeth and propagates itself by sending out runners and producing roots (*known as stoloniferous*). She has several including *Hylaeaicum mooreanum* pictured on the right.



Cheryl has maintained a collection of mini *Vrieseas* over the years, and like many of us has suffered a few losses. *Vriesea flammea* is a favourite, and makes a beautiful basket. *Vriesea delicatula* was used by John Arden to create many hybrids.

Cheryl got a mini *Vriesea* from Bird Rock Tropicals labelled #53. Derek Butcher investigated it and registered it as a cultivar ... Cheryl called it *Vriesea* 'Snow White' because it had white flowers. Cheryl (and Derek) believes it to be a species, but like a number of cultivar, a taxonomist needs to do their research and write it up.



Quesnelia is another attractive species. In particular, Cheryl got a near black Quesnelia from the Olive Branch and propagated it from seed. Although it is thought to be a species, it too has been registered as a cultivar **Quesnella** 'Black Knight' until the taxonomists do their thing.

Cheryl also discussed a number of species Nigel and Stan brought to the meeting. Species are dying out in the wild, and need our help in preserving them as the natural growing environment is under threat.
